All puzzles have two parts. In Part One, students complete the puzzle and in Part Two they fill in the message bar printed below the puzzle.

## Part One

To begin, Student A selects any blank answer on his worksheet as in the following example from the Large Animals crossword puzzle:


Student A asks his partner: What's number thirty seven across? He knows that the 4th letter is an $\mathbf{O}$ and the 7th letter is an $\mathbf{S}$.

Student B reads the hint as printed on her worksheet: A large sea creature with eight arms.

If Student A can not think of the answer, (OCTOPUS) he asks his partner for another hint (not printed). She may say, for example:

It looks like a squid.
It has a huge head.
It's called calamari in a restaurant.

All of the puzzles are ranked with stars. Puzzles \#1 ~ \#6 are ranked with two stars because they are less difficult.


Puzzles \#7~\#23 are ranked in order from $21 / 2$ to $31 / 2$ stars.
